Field Day is over. For me, this was number 41. Next year will be number 42, and then I'll discover the Meaning of It All! Or perhaps I'll say to myself, "Why have I been doing this all these years?" Field day is in the history books, and all in all I thought we had a good time and it went the way we intended it to go. The new location felt relatively safe, despite security concerns expressed by City staff. Having stayed out there both Friday and Saturday nights, I saw no issues on the park property itself. My SSB station got out poorly mainly due to missing radials on my vertical. My radial kit had been poached by copper thieves out of my storage shed in Lake LA a few weeks prior. George, KC6UVM ground out some QRP contacts under tough conditions. QRP is not easy considering the poor propagation and high QRM levels found during the contest. GOTA did well, and got a lot of new and potential HF operators some rig time. Thanks to Paul KD6SMC for doing GOTA again.

We did well for the bonus points, making just about all the categories except publicity and some of the youth potential. Kudos to Jon, N6NQ for traffic handling, Margie KG6TBR for the Ham Radio Expo table, Matt K6MES, Carol AF6OV, Eugene KG6SLC, Gary WA6WFC, and the rest of the folks who helped at the information table. Rodney KK6GOS served as Safety Officer, supplying AED and other first aid supplies. We had Tom KI6CHH out there with the CERT tent, and especially the 8 KW generator. That kept my trailer quite cool with the AC running, and throughout Saturday my trailer was a magnet for visitors coming in out of the heat. Of course, we cannot forget the food Saturday afternoon, thanks to Paul and Terry. And of course, the

At least according to the ARRL FD scoring applet, we made 1204 QSO points, and 1370 bonus points for a total score of 2574 points. We had a few lessons learned: Somewhat better antennas would have helped on some stations, a non-operating designated GOTA coach, publicity, better logging, dividing operating time between HF SSB and the QRP station to lower the station-count class, and we really need a designated photographer to document what we did. If the ARRL scores us lower, lack of photographic documentation will be the likely reason. I guess we'll find out in December.
