The Challenge of Elmering – Part 3: A Time and Place

In my last column, I talked about motivation. At this point, we can weed out people who are not motivated so we can focus on helping those who are. This month, I'm going to discuss various ways that experienced Club members can reach out and guide prospective HAMS and new licensees so they are ultimately satisfied with their goals and expectations in the hobby.

Before we can get there, people have to know that we're here. That is, promotion of the Club, exam sessions, classes, etc. The old paradigm was run an ad in the "community" sections of the local newspapers. This is fine, but now it's all about having an online presence. When I type "amateur radio" into Google, the first four hits are: 1) Wikipedia definition, 2) American Radio Relay League, 3) ARRL again, and 4) the FCC. When I combine "amateur radio" and "antelope valley", the first several entries go back to our own AVARC web page, then some from AV ARES. This is encouraging, and also by design, as I had our Internet host "rig" this. This makes our web site an important contact point. The ARRL is the other important point, as I get most exam referrals through their listing. Years that I don't do this yield many "dead" sessions, (no takers). I've yet to have a dead session that was listed on ARRL. Facebook is another good place to have a presence, and the Club does have a page there. I'm still having some issues getting it to cooperate, as it seems to be more geared up for retail business, than a volunteer organization. Facebook groups, such as "Lake LA Town Alerts", and "AV Scanners", may also present opportunities for promotion although it's important to be "tactful" on how things are posted. I'm not a "Tweeter", but if folks are, that's certainly a path to promotion. The exam sessions are by far the best opportunity, as there's your target audience. Some kind of handout will be there for the next exam session.

They call you, now what? A time and a place. Hmmm. Outside our Club meeting venue, what's available? This has been a chronic problem for classes ever since Adrienne closed the Kumon Center. Yes – we still teach, and we've received over a dozen proposals from organizations interested in instruction. As of yet, none of them have come to fruition, as desire tends to dissipate due to lack of agreed schedule and a place to do it. Our best years were the 1980's and 1990's – small, but consistent classes, perhaps 5 to 10 students, perhaps three or four times a year. It's amazing to see how many graduates from this era are still around, and all over the country. I encounter them on HF and even on DMR talkgroups. The good news is that I had a conversation with my Church's, (AV First Christian) Board of Directors, and have tacit approval for a classroom at a very reasonable rate. If our latest proposal slips by, we may "just do it". Stay tuned.

How about individual help? We now have an "Elmers" mailing list: elmer@k6ox.club. We have a group of technically minded hams monitoring this address, and hopefully can provide answers to radio-related questions. We may not
