With Baker to Vegas freshly behind us, it's time to think about the next event. Diane and I attended the 70th Annual International DX Convention in Visalia, which was sponsored by the Northern California DX Club, and took place from April 12th to 14th at the Visalia Convention Center. We even met a few local hams up there! Al, N6JZ, was there with Dan, N6SLH, and George, N6EPM, who was out here from Arkansas, and rode to Visalia with Al. This was Al's 50th year attending the International DX Convention!

If you're into chasing DX, then this is the annual convention that you'll want to attend! This convention is one of the closer ham radio events, in terms of distance from the Antelope Valley, and would take you less than three hours to drive there from much of the valley. If you're a DXer or interested in any aspect of Ham radio, then International DX Convention is the place to be.

There was a special event station, N6V, that was on the air from the convention. Attendees could sit at the station and log a few QSOs if they wanted to.

There was also a full day class on Friday called "Contest Academy" that one can attend there for \$40, that included subjects like "Train Your Weaknesses Using Contest Super Simulator", "Contesting Overseas - Advantages, Pitfalls, Tips", "Multi-Operator Contesting", "How to Record an Entire Contest and Learn From Your Mistakes", "FT8 Contesting Overview", "Conceptual Treatment of Inter-Station Interference" and "How To Attend WRTC (and get the most out of it)". The World Radiosport Team Championship (WRTC) is an onsite ham radio competition held every four years. Previous WRTCs have been held in Seattle (1990), San Francisco (1996), Slovenia (2000), Finland (2002), Brazil (2006), Russia (2010), Boston (2014), and Germany (2018). The next WRTC in 2022 will be in Italy, so this session could be useful if you're planning on attending WRTC in Italy!

When you register, you get one raffle ticket, with There is also an opportunity to take a Saturday tour, which includes a visit and lunch at Sequoia National Park. QSL card checking is available Saturday afternoon.

All attendees of the International DX Convention received a 70th anniversary patch and one raffle ticket. Each attendee also had the opportunity to buy additional raffle tickets in books of 20 for \$20.00 each. There were several prize raffles that took place during the event.

radios.

FlexRadio, makers of Software Defined Radios, had their 6000 Signature Series radios. The model ranges were the 6400 with a price of \$1999, the 6400M at \$2999, the 6600 at \$3999, the 6600M at \$4499, and the 6700 at \$6999. I was able to test each model that was on display. My favorite model is the 6400M, which I hope to own one day.

Another one of the booths that we visited were the folks at the Yaesu booth, who were displaying their latest models. Yaesu's new mobile radio FT-857D was one that I looked at. It covers HF to UHF, and the new model includes coverage of the 60-meter (5 MHz) band. This radio retails at \$799.95.

The forums included a YL forum, DX Forum, Contest Forum, DXLab User Forum", and ARRL Forum.

Presentations included were "DX Contesting as a Tourist: The Road Less Traveled", "The RIB: Radio in a Box for DXPeditions" and "NCDXF Beacon Program Update".


