

President's Corner

Field Day is here! This is our opportunity to show off to the public! Field Day is ham radio's open house, and is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend of June of each year, more than 35,000 radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or simply with friends to operate from remote locations. For many clubs, ARRL Field Day is one of the highlights of their annual calendar. Some groups will treat it as a contest. Others will use the opportunity to practice their emergency response capabilities. The contest part is simply to contact as many other stations as possible and to learn to operate our radio gear in abnormal situations and less than optimal conditions.

The AVARC will be operating this year, as we did last year, at Rawley Duntley Park, which is located on Avenue K, about half way between 30th Street West and 40th Street West, across from Marauder Stadium at Antelope Valley College.

The AVARC board members did a quick walk-through of the park to scope out where everything was going to be setup. We should be more toward the back end of the park this year, by the baseball fields. Dan had an issue last year where he was transmitting mostly to the north, and limiting the contacts mostly to that direction. This year, the location at the back of the park should let Dan setup a better ground plain by attaching the counterpoise of his vertical antenna to the chain link fence that surrounds the baseball field.

We will setting up starting on Friday afternoon, June 21st, and will be operating from 11:00 am on Saturday, June 22nd, and finishing 24 hours later at 11:00 am on Sunday. Also on Sunday morning, Adrienne, WA6YEO, will be making her famous Whiskey Six Sourdough Pancakes!

After it's all over at 11:00 am on Sunday, it's time to start to take down everything. This is when the most help is needed, because everyone is tired from being up most of the night making contacts.

Here are a few Field Day rules from the ARRL web site:

- 1. Eligibility: Field Day is open to all amateurs in the areas covered by the ARRL/RAC Field Organizations and countries within IARU Region 2. DX stations residing in other regions may be contacted for credit, and may submit entries as check-logs.
- 2. Object: To work as many stations as possible on the 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 Meter HF bands, as well as all bands 50 MHz and above, and in doing so to learn to operate in abnormal situations in less than optimal conditions. A premium is placed on developing skills to meet the challenges of emergency preparedness as well as to acquaint the general public with the capabilities of Amateur Radio.
- 3. Date and Time Period: Field Day 2019 will be held June 22-23. Field Day is ALWAYS the fourth full weekend, beginning at 1800 UTC Saturday (11:00 am PDT) and ending at 2059 UTC Sunday (2:00 pm PDT). 3.1.Class A and B (see below)

stations that do not begin setting up until 1800 UTC on Saturday (11:00 am PDT) may operate the entire 27-hour Field Day period. 3.2. Stations who begin setting up before 1800 UTC Saturday may work only 24 consecutive hours, commencing when on-the-air operations begin. 3.3. No class A or B station may begin its set-up earlier than 0000 UTC on the Friday (Thursday afternoon or evening local time (5:00 pm Thursday PDT)) preceding the Field Day period. Cumulative set-up time shall not exceed a total of 24 hours.

To help gauge the effectiveness of their efforts a "contest" element was added to the event. Points are awarded based on the number of successful contacts that a station has with other stations. Field Day has become the largest single emergency preparedness exercise in the country, with more than 35,000 operators participating. Field Day takes place over one 24 hour period, the last full weekend in June. While most traditional Field Day operations will be from under a tent or shade shelter at a park or other outdoor site, many teams operate from inside, at such places as a Emergency Operations Center, or from a served agency such as the Red Cross, Salvation Army, or a local hospital.

Emergency and alternative energy such as that supplied by generators, batteries, or solar panels is the choice of power during this exercise, owing to the fact that commercial power also tends to fail in a disaster.

All in all, it's ham radio's biggest event of the year, and we're looking forward to seeing you out there!
