President's Corner

These are the dog days of summer. The dog days of summer are taken to be the hottest, most uncomfortable part of summer in the Northern Hemisphere. This might be a good time of the year to go climb a mountain and escape the heat of the desert floor!

We had a presentation a while back about Summits On The Air, or SOTA. SOTA is an amateur radio operating award program launched in Great Britain in 2002, which is now known worldwide. SOTA's aim is to encourage licensed amateur radio operators to operate temporarily from mountainous locations, combining hiking and mountain climbing with operating their amateur radio station from the summits of hills and mountains. Those who set up a station on a summit (usually for a few minutes to a few hours) are known as activators, and those who contact ("work") activators on summits are known as chasers. Points are awarded to the activator for operating from "activating" a summit, and to each of the chasers working the activator. The higher the mountain is, the more points the activator and each chaser receive.

All equipment must be operated from a portable power source (batteries, solar cells, etc). Operation is expressly forbidden using permanently installed power sources or fossil-fuel generators of any kind. The rules state the elevation must be at least 150 meters or 492 feet. Activators must also be within the Activation Zone which is within 25 meters (or 83 feet) of the top of the summit.

There are plenty of mountaintops that can be accessed from the Antelope Valley. Table Mountain, with its peak at 7,507 feet, can be easily accessed by a short trail from nearby parking at the Mountain High North Resort. The only real drawback is the radio coverage is about 180 degrees centered at North, and blocked by higher mountains to the South. Coverage to points north, including Nevada, should be relatively easy, especially on single sideband.

Another peak not far from Table Mountain is Blue Ridge, with its peak on Wright Mountain at 8,505 feet. This one has a more omnidirectional view, and should have excellent coverage. Wright Mountain can be accessed from Guffy Campground, which is the next campground past Blue Ridge Campground. The summit is a more difficult climb, and a 3.5 mile round trip from the campground.

The tallest local summit is Mount Baden-Powell at 9,407 feet. This will require a hike that is four miles from the Vincent Gap parking area on Angeles Crest Highway, which includes 41 switchbacks, and 2,800 feet in elevation gain. This location should net you contacts from hundreds of miles away in any direction!

There are many things you can do to escape the heat of the summer, but this one should be able to net you many more contacts on VHF and UHF than other activities!

New Rules Regarding Baofeng HTs

Summary from the Survivaldispatch.com website regarding importation of Chinese radios, capable of transmitting in multiple radio services:

While the FCC did clean up the Part 95 rules and did expand the frequencies for FRS by combining them with GMRS (with power limitations), they were not consistent in some of their wording in the various subparts. However, it is quite clear that the operating, manufacture, import, sale or offer for sale any radio that: 1) is not certified and/or 2) can operate in more than one service, will be a violation of FCC rules after September 30th. What is notably absent from the new rules is the possession of a radio that can operate in multiple services, so you don't need to throw out all the Baofeng's and similar radios (however, if you are worried about possessing a radio that violates the rules I'll pay shipping and you can send it to me and I'll make sure it is not used in violation of the rules).

Between now and the end of September I think you are going to see a lot of flash sales and then very discounted prices as none of the manufacturers or sellers are going to want to have any stock on hand after September 30th.
