President's Corner

Have you ever worked a special event station? For U.S. special event stations, these stations can usually be recognized by their callsign, which is often a 1x1 callsign, such as one of the two callsigns that the Antelope Valley Amateur Radio Club runs at Field Day, K6A (except for this year). This year, right after Field Day, there was a series of special event stations up and down the East Coast during the week of July 4th that were commemorating the original 13 colonies. There were 13 special event stations, one in each of the original 13 colonies, each station with a sequential callsign that ran from K2A in New York, through K2M in Pennsylvania. The goal is to try to work as many of those stations as you can. These stations will usually have a special QSL card that you can get in exchange for your QSL card.

Diane and I will usually jump when we see one of these types of callsigns, and go on QRZ to see what the special event is, then try to work the station and then send for the OSL card after successfully working the station. The special events that we have worked since Field Day are the 13 Colonies special event stations (K2A through K2M, and two bonus stations, one in Philadelphia and one in the UK), the Red river Bridge War in Texas (W5I), Watoga State Park Mountain Trail Challenge Half Marathon and 5K Run in West Virginia (W8W), the Navajo Code Talkers in Arizona (N7C), the 65th Annual Auburn, Cord, Dusenberg Festival in Auburn, Indiana (K9A) that celebrated the 120th anniversary of the Auburn Automobile Company, the Buffalo Soldiers special event in Texas (W5W and W5B), and the Kansas QSO Party, with each county in Kansas represented by a 1x1 callsign. You could get a special certificate if you worked enough stations to spell out words that represent Kansas using (Continued on page 3)

a letter in each callsign to spell out words, such as SUNFLOWER, KAN-SAS, QSOPARTY, and YEL-LOWBRICKROAD. I managed to get only three of those stations, so I couldn't spell any of those words!

There are also other stations elsewhere in the world that will have special event callsigns, but usually not in the 1x1 format. There is a club thst is dedicated to the FT8 format, called the FT8 Digital Mode Club, or FT8DMC. There were several special event stations throughout the world with special callsigns, such as in New Zealand, their local branch of the club ran the special event with te callsign ZL6FTDMC. France ran callsign TO8FTDM. managed to get those two, as well as Argentina's LR8FTDMC. There were several other stations for that special event that I didn't get, though.

Other international stations will be celebrating an anniversary of an event or organization, and will often have the anniversary number in the special event callsign, such as the Polish Amateur Radio Union 90th Anniversary, with callsigns such as 3Z90PZK, HF90PZK, SN90PZK and SP90PZK, or even Austria's 25 years in the European Union, with several callsigns running, such as OE25AVD, OE25BKC, and OE25DMT.

There are even COVID-19 "StavHome" such as Stations, 8A1STAYHOME (Indonesia), 9K9STAYHOME (Kuwait), AX2020STAYHOME (Australia), HZ1STAYHOME (Saudi Arabia), TC1STAYHOME (Turkey), VC2STAY-HOM and XM2STAYHOM (Canada, without the "E" at the end as the regulator only allows suffixes of up to seven letters). I worked 6Y6STAYHOME in Jamaica in July, and I'm still waiting on a QSL card from them!

Next club meeting via Zoom September 24 'eyeball' QSOs 19:00 hrs meeting start 19:30 hrs.


